Bishop Michael Nazir-Ali was the Bishop of Rochester for 15 years, until September 2009. He is originally from Southwest Asia and was the first Diocesan Bishop in the Church of England born abroad. He was appointed in 1994 having previously been Bishop of Raiwind in Pakistan and then the General Secretary of CMS. He is now President of the Oxford Centre for Training, Research, Advocacy and Dialogue (OXTRAD) which seeks to prepare Christians for ministry in situations where the Church is in danger of persecution, enabling Christian workers and pastors to bring the Gospel to bear on the important questions they face. Michael is also President of GAFCON-UK.
